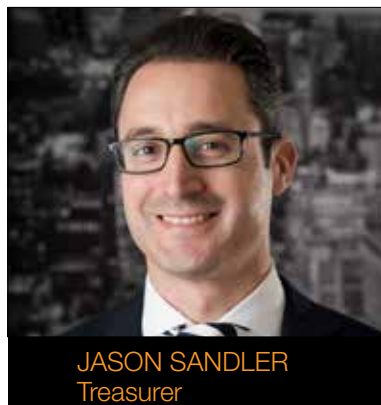
### ALLAN VIDOR

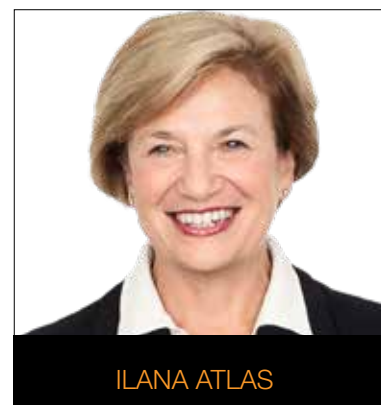
### JASON SANDLER

The 2016-2017 year provided a great opportunity to recognise our proud past. Early in the year our 80th Birthday celebrations not only brought our Jewish community together but the moving address by Malcolm Turnbull clearly demonstrated the importance of

JewishCare to the entire Australian community. Such was the impact of some of the powerful images from the post War period that they are now a permanent fixture in our Community Lounge, reminding the thousands of people who use our facilities every year of the history and importance of JewishCare.

The much anticipated changes resulting from the full implementation of National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and Consumer Directed Care (CDC) are being fully absorbed. Under these changes, clients and consumers now have the opportunity to select the organisation who will provide their care needs

Present indications suggest that our client numbers will remain relatively stable and of course while client numbers are critical to sustainability of JewishCare as an organisation, the difference we are able to make to individual's lives is our ultimate mission. We are delighted that in the 2017 Client Survey which was conducted by the Voice Group, JewishCare recorded outstanding results, which were generally well above that of our industry. The Board remains confident that the JewishCare team are providing the highest quality services for our clients

We continue to take the lead in addressing key issues currently affecting those in need in our community. We are confident that the recent initiative in conjunction with other key stakeholders, in establishing the Jewish Suicide Prevention Strategy, will play a role in reducing the number of suicides within our community. This initiative further reinforces our commitment to work together with other organisations and individuals to guarantee the best possible outcomes.

A new 'state of the art' client management system which includes mobility devices for all staff who provide services for people in their own homes, is the latest example of the Board's commitment to enhancing the technological infrastructure of the organisation. This infrastructure is essential in order for us to provide best practice service, reporting and invoicing, now and into the future.

As a community we are indeed very fortunate to be able to call on the skills and commitment of so many talented people to help guide the organisation into the future. The process of Board renewal continued during the year as we welcomed Ilana Atlas to the already impressive Board of JewishCare bringing further strong governance and management skills.

The success of JewishCare is due to the skill of our team of over 200 people and our wonderful volunteers. Led by CEO Claire Vernon they have continued to deliver high quality services with a level of care, professionalism and passion that should make our community proud.

It has been an honour to serve as a Director and as Treasurer of JewishCare over the past 12 months. I would like to express my gratitude to previous Treasurer, Lawrence Myers, who worked with me over a period of six months to ensure a smooth transition. Lawrence

was Treasurer for 9 years and made an enormous impact on the organisation. I thank Allan Vidor, Claire Vernon, Andrew Fodor, the Board and management team for their support since my appointment.

2017 was another important transitional year for JewishCare with the introduction of Consumer Directed Care (“CDC”) and the National Disability Insurance Scheme (“NDIS”). These changes bring both threats and opportunities to the organisation. The Mental Health and Disability teams and the Community Aged team have done an excellent job in responding to these changes. Our NDIS readiness program continues to be rolled out with strong results. We have also been able to maintain our position as an aged care provider of choice for the community notwithstanding the threats presented by CDC and the resultant competition in the market. JewishCare also successfully implemented an upgraded client management system which was a large and challenging project and which will support CDC and NDIS.

Despite these challenges, JewishCare recorded an operating surplus of \$98,154 for the year ended 30 June 2017 (2016: \$302,869) – an excellent result. The surplus is the result of continued disciplined financial management. The organisation was able to adapt quickly to new revenue models under CDC and NDIS and management were able to maintain tight control over costs.

## SOURCES OF FUNDS

JewishCare’s sources of funds remains consistent with prior years.

Government funding remains the largest source of funding for JewishCare, contributing around 35% of income. The way this income is received has changed materially over the past 12 months under NDIS and CDC and will continue to evolve. JewishCare has upgraded its systems and processes to handle these

changes.

The Conference on Jewish Material Claims against Germany (Claims Conference) represents our second largest funding source – contributing around 21% of income. The Holocaust survivor population continues to age and JewishCare is there to provide them with support. JewishCare is instrumental in seeking out those in need and ensuring they get the funding required for their ongoing care.

Earned income from client fees contributed around 17% of total income for the year. This was consistent with prior years.

We are grateful to the community and to JCA for their continued support. JCA allocations for the year amounted to \$1.9m and contributed around 13% of total income. We continue to take a reduced allocation from the JCA and hope to continue this trend as JewishCare builds the corpus of its Foundation Trusts. Grants from the JewishCare Foundation Trusts amounted to \$1.155m for the year and contributed 8% to total income. JewishCare is committed to building the corpus in the Foundation Trusts and in doing so will reduce our reliance on community funding.

Direct donations contributed 7% of total income and we are grateful to the many donors for this. We would especially like to thank the Lowy family for providing continued support for the Chai Foundation, and for entrusting us to use funds from this Foundation for the provision of additional services to our community.

## USES OF FUNDS

Operating expenditure increased by 17% over the prior year to \$14,605,644 from \$12,453,224.

Employee expenses remain by far the largest use of our resources contributing 83% of total expenditure. Staff numbers increased by 11% during the year, to 142 full time equivalent staff members. The additional staff were deployed to deliver services to our clients.

## ASSETS

The Total assets of JewishCare as at 30 June 2017 were \$15,674,554 (2016: \$14,576,672). Real property assets comprise 42% of this balance and cash comprises 41%.

## LIABILITIES

Total liabilities as at 30 June 2017 were \$4,409,766 (2016: \$3,410,038). 32% of this balance relates to employee liabilities which have increased in line with increasing staff levels and tenure. 33% of this balance relates to funds received in advance from the JCA.

Trade and other payables remain low at 7% of annual

turnover.

## FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Board and management decisions are supported by the timely reporting received from JewishCare's Finance and Administration team. The Board is pleased with the senior and program managers' skills in the day-to-day operations as well their contribution to the budgeting process. JewishCare's management team has continued to demonstrate a commitment to quality of service to clients.

## BURGER CENTRE

Sir Moses Montefiore Home and JewishCare operate The Burger Centre aged day care facility in partnership, holding equal rights in the registered company - The Burger Centre Pty Ltd.

During FY 2017 no financial support was provided to The Burger Centre. The annual result was a \$35,612 surplus and JewishCare recorded 50% of this amount. JewishCare

has accounted for the investment carrying value in line with the requirements of Australian Accounting Standards.

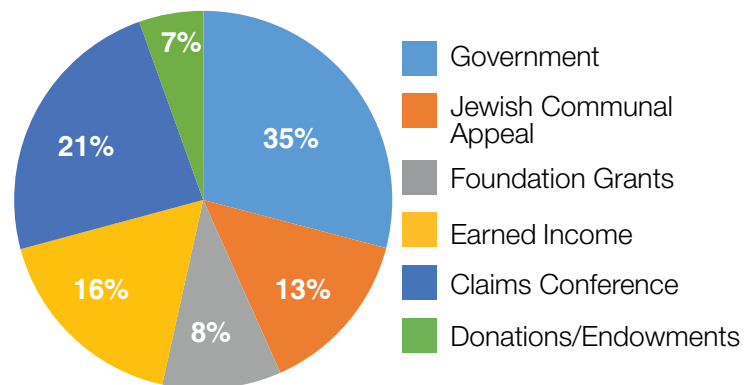
## CONCLUSION

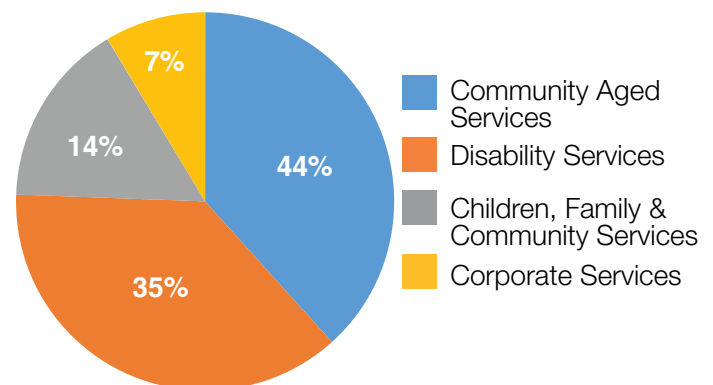

## CHANGING THE WAY WE DO THINGS

Knowing and understanding the environment and market place you operate in is critical for a successful business and is even more so in the not for profit sector.

The changes brought about by the Aged Care reforms and the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) has meant JewishCare has had to adapt and change the way JewishCare works in the Jewish community.

These changes have placed the client, or participant, in control and is enabling them to make choices about what support they receive and from whom they purchase these supports and services.

This is not a new direction for JewishCare as in late 2013 we set a strategic goal to be the trusted provider of choice in the Jewish community. Much of our work in the past year has been focussed on achieving this goal and there are a number of examples which highlight our achievements.

For example JewishCare identified the need to support people with a disability and their families to plan for the introduction of the NDIS and developed and published a preplanning guide which was very well received. It enabled people to consider for the first time what would make a difference in their lives and what funding this would require. We set a goal to offer preplanning to all the people we are involved with in our Disability Program and our Mental Health and Wellbeing. The outcomes have been significant with positive results for so many people with a disability and their families.

We also undertook a significant review of our Our Mental Health and Wellbeing Program as we considered how to best support people living with a mental illness and what we had learnt from these people and their families about what makes a difference. We convened a Client Reference Group and asked participants to co-design our programs. The outcome has been an increase in our social participation groups including a number of new groups including a Women's Group, Hebrew classes and a continuation of our popular Shabbat meals.

We all know that our staff are our greatest resource and the way an organisation treats its staff is directly correlated to how those staff work with the people we support. JewishCare conducted a staff climate survey in late 2016 to see how staff are feeling about their job, the organisation and management. The results were outstanding with 96% of staff of the view that we make a positive difference in the community and over 80% of staff are highly engaged and passionate about our work. These results are even more impressive considering the changes we are going through.

We are also investing in our infrastructure to support staff better and to drive efficiencies. The majority of the 240 staff work outside of Fischl House and the introduction of mobility devices will enable them to stay more connected by phone, email and our intranet which provides on-line training. It also automates rosters and allows our clients to sign on to a screen to confirm they have received a service.

We are able to continue to adapt and respond to these changes with the strategic guidance from the Board.

I am grateful for the ongoing support of the Board and staff as we work to ensure JewishCare is well placed as the provider of choice in the Jewish community.

# GREAT PROGRESS FOR DANNY & MANDY



Danny Sawday is now 34 years old. His parents Mandy and Rony knew something was not right with him, when at 10 months he seemed to stop developing. "His vocabulary just never progressed like it did with Danny's elder brother Adam. When the family went to Israel, a few old aunties said don't worry he will be fine but we were worried." said Mandy.

Mandy took Danny to many doctors and centres and they tried to encourage his speech but when Danny was around 2½ years old multiple doctors diagnosed him with Autism, intellectual delay and a probability of never being able to talk. At the time this diagnosis was not as common as it is today and there were fewer facilities and resources available.

Danny was taken to numerous schools and the family tried everything possible but in Mandy's words "the battle really started when he was 18 years old and finished school. Finding a suitable place for him to go was just so difficult. He remained non-verbal and continued to exhibit challenging and self-injurious behaviour that were impossible to predict and we never knew how long each episode would last. This dominated our lives. "Danny seemed so frustrated it was breaking our hearts" said Mandy.

**JewishCare has been an important part of the family's life for decades but the last 3 years have been a revelation.**

With the help of Terri Jackson, a JewishCare disability Caseworker, Danny has made remarkable progress. This has resulted from his engagement with Eilen, a gym teacher who specialises in helping people with a disability and Debbie an amazing speech therapist. The combination of these two therapies has changed so many aspects of Danny's life.

"Danny just loves his gym sessions, I can tell his state of mind from his face and during these classes he is so calm even when doing really hard exercises. He responds so well to Eilen and is becoming so fit. His rapport with Debbie is equally incredible, he is really stimulated by her classes and his communication skills have leapt ahead and he is now able and willing to follow multiple commands and he engages with great enthusiasm" said Mandy.

Unlike some people with Autism, Danny has always been very loving towards his family and especially Mandy but now although he still exhibits some challenging behaviours they don't last as long and he just seems less frustrated and more affectionate than he previously was. Importantly this happier state continues through most of

the day. "I can see a state of contentment in his face that was rarely visible in the past" said Mandy

**"I cant thank JewishCare enough, because without Terri's help we never would have engaged with Eilen and Debbie. JewishCare has helped us financially with Chai Foundation funding plus Terri has always been there for me like my private counsellor. She is just so empathic and proactive. I am lost for words what a difference JewishCare has made to our lives" said Mandy.**







# AMAZING RESILIENCE OF ERNIE BERNITZ

Ernie and Jessie arrived in Australia 12 years ago from South Africa to join their son Harold and his family who had arrived 11 years previously. While Ernie was aware that he had some health issues including diabetes, bad circulation and the aftermath of polio that he contracted in 1928, he could not have predicted that within days of arriving, the lower part of his right leg would have to be amputated.

It was in fact this emergency procedure initiated by Harold that prevented a far more serious scenario from unfolding. Since then he has endured a range of ongoing health issues including gangrene on his remaining leg which required a total leg amputation.

The result has been that his once active and independent life has changed dramatically to the point that he had been wheel chair bound for many years. He now requires assistance to get out of bed in the morning, to dress and to be put back into bed every night, plus to perform a whole range of daily living tasks. This situation has imposed substantial change on the whole family but especially on Jessie his wife of 62 years.

**Despite these challenges Ernie's spirit has never waned and in the words of his daughter-in-law Robyn he remains 'a force of nature'.**

More recently he had a major health crisis requiring an extended hospitalisation and a far from optimistic prognosis, but he prevailed and attended his grand-daughter's wedding and is now back home.

For many years another provider was providing home support services to Ernie but the family was not happy with certain administrative aspects of the service and they contacted JewishCare.

**"That was a great decision. JewishCare who now provide my Level IV package have really made such a positive impact on my life.**

The workers are very professional and caring and the improvement has not only been of benefit to me but importantly it has also helped Jessie to lead a more normal life" said Ernie.

Ensuring consistent high quality care is of critical importance. JewishCare Case Worker Yuliya Resnikov said "we have over 70 dedicated staff who go out to people's homes. We treat every person as an individual. We put a lot of effort into ensuring we achieve the right match which is for the benefit of both the worker and the person they are helping. One example is a highly qualified worker, Katy, with expertise in physiotherapy and manual handling, was hired by JewishCare and immediately was

placed on the team that helps Ernie. This has been of substantial benefit to the family".

**As well as accessing his package 7 days a week Ernie is also able to access JewishCare's complementary Links program in which volunteers visit isolated members of the community for a chat and where appropriate go out.**

While the latter option is not possible with Ernie, two Links volunteers come over to chat and spend an hour each week with him. "I really enjoy these visits, we have a good laugh while solving the world's problems. These volunteers are very generous people and Links is such a valuable program for me.

"Our community is very fortunate to have JewishCare. I know first-hand they do it better than any other provider" said Ernie.



# REMARKABLE STORY OF MIRIAM & ISAAC

Like tens of thousands of fellow Jews, Isaac and Miriam migrated to Australia from the African continent. Their story is however different for one very significant reason. Isaac and Miriam come not from South Africa or Zimbabwe, they come from Nigeria which contrary to popular belief, is a country that has 50,000 people who follow Jewish practices. Isaac and Miriam knew each other in Nigeria and in 2011 Isaac decided to migrate to Sydney.

With no job and no established expat community for support, times were extremely challenging and he contacted the Family Services team at JewishCare.

**The team was able to help him in a number of ways including assistance to enrol at university and to access housing as well as providing financial help. Most critically JewishCare's Companies that Care (CTC) program, the program which links job seekers with companies whose owners offer jobs to fellow community members, helped Isaac to find a job at Toymate which is a company owned by Danny Bloom.**

This came about via Merle Klug who has had a long and successful career in recruitment and who volunteers with CTC program.

3 years ago, Isaac's financial situation had improved sufficiently for him to ask Miriam to join him.

Miriam too, had a very difficult time in the period after she arrived. She had to re-qualify to continue working in pathology and was feeling very lonely. She persisted and passed all the required exams, but then she could not find a job. She became more depressed with every knock back she got. "Nothing was working, said Miriam "I didn't know what to do, I was desperate, then for the second time, Merle came to our rescue". This time Merle contacted her friend, Lynne Seskin who works for a pathology company.

Lynne said "On meeting Miriam I felt such a strong bond. My husband and I also came from Africa, but in our case South Africa, so we had the opportunity to join an established community including relatives, school and family friends and other acquaintances. Miriam and Isaac had nothing but their indomitable will to succeed. They are both lovely warm people and fellow Jews from a completely different background. Fortunately I was in a position to help Miriam to get a job".

When a suitable position became available in the company she worked for, Lynne proposed Miriam. This landed Miriam that lucky break she needed and since then she has impressed everyone and has already been

promoted from Lab Aid to Scientific Officer. Life is looking even more exciting for Miriam and Isaac. They married under the chuppah, Isaac is only months away from finishing his law degree and the couple are expecting a baby.

"I never could have accomplished this without the help and support of Lynne and Merle who showed so much faith in me and of course this all started when Isaac initially received life changing support from JewishCare. We have been blessed" said Miriam.
