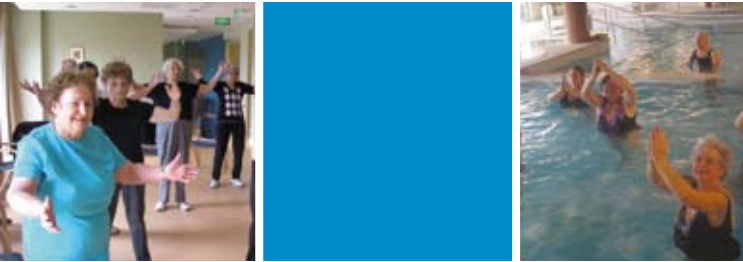

The Day Centre program provides structured group activities for people who live in their own homes.

What we offer

- Transport to and from The Centre
- Kosher morning tea and hot lunch
- Outings and day trips
- Great speakers and fabulous entertainers
- A wide range of stimulating programs
- Computer classes and Nintendo Wii activities
- Arts and crafts
- Falls risk assessment and referral to physiotherapy if required
- Group education programs in areas such as health promotion and recreation
- Communication and liaison with carers as appropriate
- Access to a range of services to enable you to stay at home including a comprehensive assessment
- Living with Memory Loss program run with Alzheimer's Australia

Who is eligible to attend

The Day Centre program is funded for:

- People living in the following LGA's – Randwick, Botany, Sydney, Waverley, Woollahra who
- are living in the community who are frail aged or have mild to moderate memory loss or
- are carers of those living with dementia who require respite

Making a referral

Anyone can make a referral and confidentiality is guaranteed.

It is a requirement that you have the consent of the person prior to making a referral to The Burger Centre.

After a referral is made

A worker will assess each person's eligibility to attend The Burger Centre as well as offering other support services if appropriate

Those eligible to attend the Centre will be:

- Contacted to make a time to attend an initial visit, with a family member if possible
- Invited to come in for morning tea and take part in some of The Centre's activities
- Assessed, after which an individual plan will be developed
- Contacted to determine the most suitable day of attendance and pick-up/drop off details

Cost

The Burger Centre is subsidised by government and community funds. There is an initial administrative fee of \$50 then a daily fee of \$18.50 (\$16 if you are on a pension).

No person will be denied services based on inability to pay. If necessary a financial assessment will be undertaken.

Fees may be adjusted on an annual basis.
